

They're the kind of imaginative installations we've come to know and love from the Kips Bay Decorator Show House Palm Beach (kipsbaydecoratorshowhouse.org) and, as always, offered a refreshing twist. So, while the residence nestles into the SoSo neighborhood of West Palm Beach, it could have been anywhere in the world an enchanting forest, a Turkish tent, a cacti garden nodding to the contemporary forms of Mexican architect Luis Barragán. Sinuous shapes, sumptuous fabrics and a sophisticated color palette take the beloved Palm Beach aesthetic and turn it on its head. Even the home's architecture, modern and geometric, gave it a fresh perspective. Benefiting Kips Bay Boys & Girls Club and Boys & Girls Clubs of Palm Beach County, this year's showhouse radiated creativity, from the Murano glass interpretation of a Sputnik chandelier to the bedroom sanctuary awash in seashells and carved rock crystals. 


